








Today, Jim Barron performs for corporate events, festivals, fundraisers and even schools. Unusual and notable performances by Barron include escaping from a regulation straightjacket before nine thousand people during halftime at the first Ft. Wayne Freedom football game. He also successfully predicted the final score of a Ft. Wayne Wizards baseball game before a record, sold out crowd.

Upon graduation from Vincennes University with a degree in Broadcasting Technology, he started a career in radio, all the while perfecting the speaking and comedic skills he employs in his live comedy magic performance. Today, when he's not appearing with his magic act, he's part of the award winning morning team at WBCL radio in Ft. Wayne.



CENTURY DIVISION: Teams limited to 4 players (Century Division must keep 100 years on the court with 3 players at all times). **Deadline is 12 o'clock noon**, games start at approx. 1.

For anyone over 18 who still wants to play.

OPEN DIVISION: Teams limited to 4 players, can be over 18 (but don't HAVE to be). **Deadline** is 12 o'clock noon, games start at approx. 2.

Players cannot play in both the Century and Open Divisions.

Guidelines:

Referees will call the games (their decisions are final). Tournament is double elimination. Cash awards of \$200 (first place) and \$100 (second place) will be awarded. Entries (in these divisions only) will still be accepted until day of tournament. Must be at least three paid entries for

competition to take place. Each team to pay \$75 entry fee with pre-registration (in our office by April 21). *All pre-registered teams will get T-shirts*. After that, please bring your \$75 to the tournament site during the younger teams' tournaments. **Make checks payable to LaGwana**.



Heartland Country CLOGGERS



Since 1994, the Heartland Country Cloggers have been dancing their way into the hearts of the people throughout Northern Indiana. They do both traditional and contemporary performances.

Dancers in the group range from the young to the young-at-heart; each Clogger is dedicated to the joy of performing his or her art. Appreciative audiences are their greatest reward. They have performed at county fairs, festivals, nursing homes, parades, private parties and many more.

The word "clog" is a Gaelic term meaning "time". Clogging is "time" dancing in which the heel is the time keeper. With roots in European and African steps and styling, clogging is a combination of tap dance, square dance and Irish step. In this country, the dance was first unique to Southern Appalachia. It is great family-fun and exercise. •

JOHNSON BENTLEY BAND


