Sew your creativity while exploring quilt stores, resting at quilt-group-friendly hotels, dining at locally owned restaurants, and joining hands-on experiences in Shipshewana.

As the third-largest Amish community in the nation, Shipshewana is steeped in heritage and craftsmanship. Quilting here isn't just an art—it's a way of life. The Amish are known for their meticulously hand-stitched quilts, using time-honored techniques that reflect both beauty and simplicity. Explore shops, markets, and studios where these stunning works of art come to life and connect with a community where quilting continues to be a powerful expression of faith, family, and tradition.

Visit more than **20 Amish and local quilt and fabric shops** where you'll find tens of thousands of yards of fabrics, custom patterns, notions, fat quarters, and quilting machines, including long-arm machines such as Bernina and Featherweight. Extend your experience by finding vintage treasures at the Midwest's largest Flea Market.

Immerse yourself in a community devoted to guilds, retreats, and individual quilters tailored to your needs. Join **demos**, **workshops**, and **classes** taught by experts. Follow the **Barn Quilt Trail**, which features more than 80 stunningly crafted barn quilts. Then, create your own **hands-on experience** with the artist. Tour **Quilt Gardens** showcasing vibrant blooms planted in quilt block designs.

# 3 DAYS - 2 NIGHTS













#### Day One

Visit Quilt Gardens at Krider Gardens, Farmstead Inn, Dutch Country Market and Das Dutchman Essenhaus.

Visit **The Quilt Shop** at Das Dutchman Essenhaus to discover handmade Amish quilts from local quilters and enjoy a hands-on quilt card class. Learn the **history, technique, construction**, and how quilts are locally sourced in Amish Country.

Your next stop is a delightful Amish couple known as the Amish Rag Rug Weavers. Step inside their cozy Dawdy house, where Leo will show you his handmade loom and demonstrate how he weaves colorful threads and textiles into beautiful woven rugs. Bring some cash to purchase an authentic Amish woven rug.

Step back in time at **Menno-Hof Cultural Center** to explore the rich history of the Amish through multimedia presentations and hands-on displays, including antique quilt displays, textiles, woven rugs, and other handcrafted items. The welcoming museum offers a view into the simpler lifestyle and culture where quilting is a huge focus.

Try the delicious Amish haystack meal served inside an Amish home for dinner before checking in to your Shipshewana cozy boutique hotel.

#### Day Two:

Enjoy a hearty, hot breakfast at your host hotel.

Start your shopping day early at **Yoder's Department Store** and **The Cotton Corner**. Here, you will find a quilter's paradise filled with over **20,000 bolts of fabric** and the region's largest selection of major brand fabrics, supplies, notions, patterns, **original designs**, and longarm and **Bernina** machines. Stop in for a **demo** and chat with experienced, helpful staff. It's a local favorite for quilters that welcomes quilt groups throughout the year.

Next, head to downtown Shipshewana to shop at Lolly's Fabrics inside the historic four-story Davis Mercantile. You'll find a large assortment of fabrics from Moda, Kaufman, RJ, and a literal 'boatload' of fat quarters inside. With over 13,000 bolts of fabric to choose from, you'll be spoiled for choice when it comes to making your own unique pattern.

Meet owner Elsie, who will happily guide you through the fabric store. She'll even hand out welcome bags to help you design your next quilt. Step beneath the beautiful **Lord's Supper Quilt** and hear the story behind its creation.

Across the hall, be sure and stop into the Lang Store for more patterns, kits, notions, and fabrics.

Just outside on Morton Street, you'll visit **Rebecca Haarer's Antique and Vintage Quilt Shop**. Meet Rebecca as she shows you her collection and offers insights into all things quilting.

Just down the road at I Sell Fabric, you'll find 1,200 bolts of Australian Aboriginal fabric, Fossil-Fern Design, and holiday fabrics.

Enjoy an Amish Thresher Buffet Meal followed by a family-friendly musical or top name concert at the **Blue Gate Restaurant and Theatre**.











#### Day Three:

Enjoy a hot breakfast at your host hotel.

Visit **Teaberry Wood Products** and meet owner LaVern Miller to create your own **wooden quilt block puzzle** made from exotic wood pieces for a memorable keepsake from your **Quilt This City Tour**.

OR

Create your own Barn Quilt with local artist Karen Weiland, who will guide you in painting your own 12" x 12" Barn Quilt block replica.

Before lunch, stop in at **Carolyn's Kitchen** to taste her no-sugar-added jams and jellies. Grab a sample from more than 20 flavors made fresh in her Amish kitchen. Bring along a little cash so you can take home jars of your favorites!

Next, meet Elaine, an Amish housewife, who will teach you how to make quilts the old-fashioned way, without any machines, just needle and thread. Make sure to keep cash handy to shop for quilts, fabrics, and accessories.

Afterward, enjoy a delicious lunch at **The Carriage House**, an Amish farm experience featuring fresh food, handmade breads, and plenty of pie. You won't leave hungry or disappointed.

Before you head home, stop by **Eash Sales** to purchase a ready-made barn quilt of your own. Time permitting, take in a few of the more than 80 custom-designed barn quilts along the **Barn Quilt Trail**.
